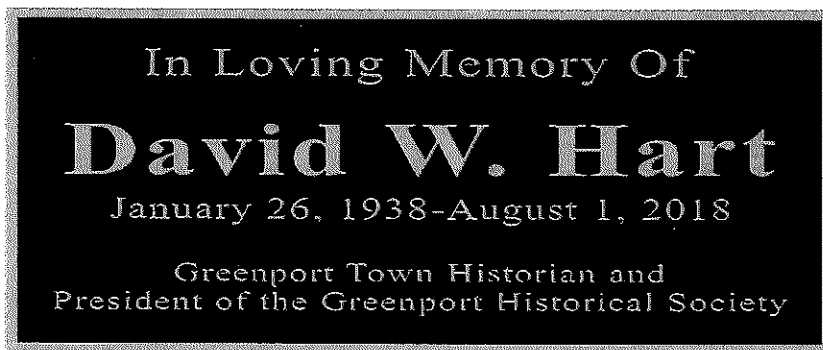
A note of gratitude to our immediate past president, Jo von Bierberstein, who also must be recognized for the support she gave to Nancy. Thank you, Jo.

Local History News: Congratulations to Life members and long time supporters of GHS, Mr. and Mrs. Richard Holmes on the 80th year of Holmquest Farms, located on Spook Rock Road. It began as a dairy farm and today is a great place to get plants, fresh vegetables, and to cut your own flowers!

The Hudson Area Library's recent exhibit of the Local Historical Maps and Atlases collection featured an 1888 Town of Greenport Map and Business Directory. The map shows roads and names of many residences from the Stockport Line to Livingston, including Catskill Station. (A left off Rt. 9H - near Toyota)

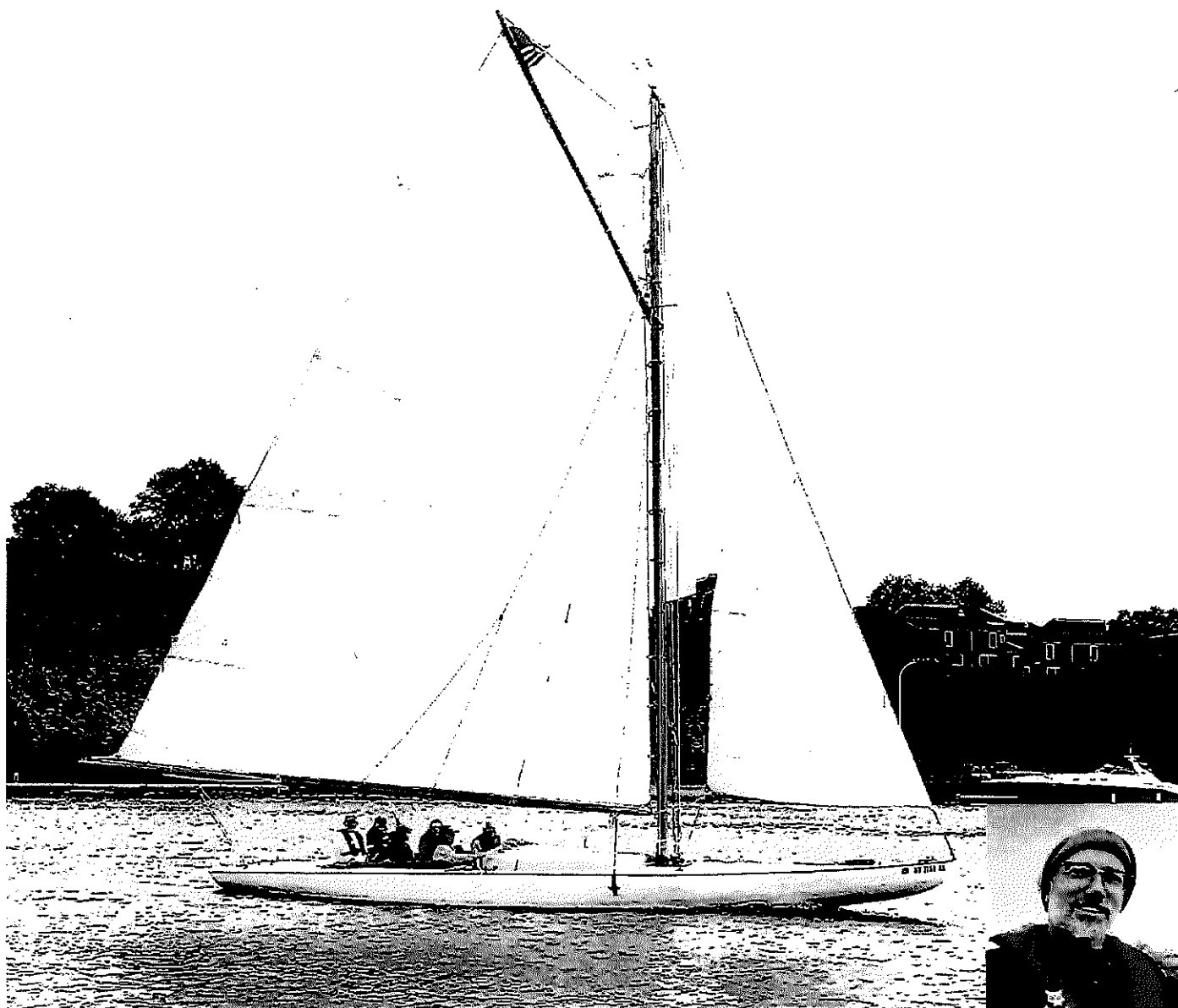


James Benziger's dairy museum is actually a 30 year personal collection of vintage dairy memorabilia that is displayed in a large barn. The collection contains everything from vintage milk bottles to vintage dairy equipment and everything in between relating to the dairy industry. It contains items from the local Columbia County area as well as from all of New York State.

The display is a visual tribute to dairy farmers and an attempt to preserve the rich history of dairy farming in New York State. The museum is handicapped accessible and seating is available. Also vehicles can be driven right up to the front entrance.

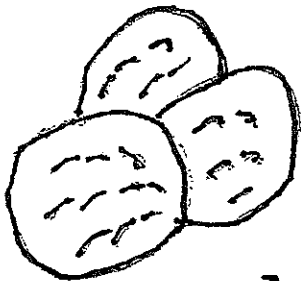
